

Looking back I remember

a teacher telling our class of girls that some of us would remain single because more girls than boys were born in our decade. I was happy to accept I would be what was called then a "blue stocking", defined as a woman more interested in academic study than marriage. I have not regretted my choice nor reversed it.

With better health provision and diet we live longer and being single is not such a once in a life time choice. Many young people are single for longer and many older people are left widowed. Divorce is more common and there are more single households than 50 years ago. Being single is not a hard or fast choice any longer.

It is worth examining what it means to be single both for ourselves and also for our relationships with others who may find themselves single, perhaps reluctantly. In order to understand and share love within community either in the church or in a wider sphere we may need to adjust some of our ideas and our speech. A good way to do that is by sharing our experiences both negative and positive.

Sam Allberry who has chosen to remain single in his book "Seven Myths about Singleness" brings out some of the assumptions which hinder us from living a happy and productive life as single people. It is assumed in general that a single person has no opportunity for intimacy or family life and that singleness hinders helping those who live in families because of lack of understanding. He argues that is not necessarily so.


Another example of a single person is Henry Nouwen who as a celibate priest with an enormous capacity for love, lived a full life, not without its struggles. In his writings he brings out the distinction between loneliness which can be emotionally painful and solitude which can be healing and creative. Because of our uniqueness, all of us,

single or married, may experience both. In the pages of the Bible we read of many kinds of human relationships, both positive and not so positive. It is a resource to turn to for both guidance and encouragement. Its pages contain examples of people who have lived positively as single people including Jesus of Nazareth and Paul of Tarsus.

Perhaps we have never thought to turn to the Bible for inspiration about living wisely whatever our circumstances as single people. We may be surprised at what it contains about life, love and community set in the context of God who loves all that he has made, including each of us.

To gain more insight and understand there is a seminar at the vicarage at 11 am on Sunday 27th October with opportunity for both the single and the married to listen and to share. The aim is to build up our community in love and show appreciation for all the many gifts others have as well as see our own in a new light.

Ray's Ironmongery

Ray's, established in 1810, was one of many Dedham shops which moved from one High Street premises to another. In the 1930s it occupied the site of the present Essex Rose tearoom on the corner of Mill Lane and was known as Major Ray's Bazaar. As was usual for shops in the village at that time, it sold a bewildering variety of merchandise, stocking everything from paint, distemper, stoves and oil lamps to gardening tools, galvanised pails, enamel jugs, clothes and footwear of all kinds including "dull rubber wellington boots at an astonishingly low price". Hardware included china plates, cups and saucers, which my parents remembered were placed on the scales and sold by weight in the 1930s. Merchandise set out on the pavement included a display of walking sticks and John Jennings told me that in those innocent days, Dedham boys would feel very daring helping themselves to a stick and walking round with it through Stratford St Mary before putting it back.

This shop closed on the outbreak of war in 1939 but since 1922 Major Charles Ray's son Edwin Charles (Eddie) had had his own business, setting up delivery services to Suffolk at first with a horsedrawn van purchased with his WWI army gratuity. His first showroom was in "Grandma's Greenhouse (after removal of the Grapevine)" in 1926. Since the 1930s a vast amount of extra stock had been kept at Rays' General Warehouses behind the then Post Office, where Piper House is now. There were petrol pumps outside, one at the front and three down Princel Lane. By the time I remember it in the 1950s Eddie Ray had incorporated the Post Office Stores, acquired by his wife Marion in 1917, into "Rays' Arcade". He took down a number of internal walls (some alarmingly were load-bearing!), so as to open it up as a department store and would usher customers a few feet from one counter to another for different purchases.

Amazingly the whole building did not collapse but it eventually burned down. After Eddie Ray retired the shop was owned by a Trust and managed by Wesley Downes and his son Barry. A fire broke out on 3rd June 1976 with flames forty or fifty feet high and a cloud of smoke visible for miles around. Loud bangs could be heard because of the large quantities of paint and Calor gas stored on the premises. Peter Rowe who lived in a flat at the back of the shop lost everything he possessed and a collection was organised in the village to help him fund replacements. Even his cat had gone missing but happily it reappeared some time later safe and sound.

Sadly the burnt-out shop and the damaged boutique and hairdresser next door, both listed buildings of historic interest, were subsequently demolished.

After his wife died Eddie offered her clothes etc. second-hand for sale in the shop. He sold me three of her teaspoons (which he termed "a quarter-dozen"!) and a tablespoon for making coffee in my room at Oxford.


He used to fill the window of the shop with old photographs of daily and Dedham history covered with scrawled annotations conveying a vast amount of interesting information. Similarly he used to waylay people in the street and run on for hours with his reminiscences, talking at high speed so as to allow no pause which would give his listener a chance to break the flow and move on.

I think I may well have been the last person to see him alive. I had parked on North Hill in Colchester and was about to get in and drive home when he accosted me and said he wasn't feeling very well and could I give him a lift back to Dedham. He sat beside me apparently in excellent form and talking non-stop all the way. I dropped him off at the top of Princel Lane and the following morning he was found dead alone in his house.

DEDHAM PLAYERS LATEST PRODUCTION COMMEMORATES THE 75TH ANNIVERSARY OF D-DAY

Rehearsals are in full swing for the Dedham Players October production of 'Pressure' by David Haig. The play, directed by Kelvin Hastings-Smith, tells the story of the events of the weekend immediately prior to the launch of D-Day and is a fitting commemoration of the 75th Anniversary of the most momentous military operation in history.

A very strong cast has been assembled which includes Danielle Tile, last seen as Emma in Dedham Players' last production, as well as Mike Cook (Humble Boy, Emma), Gary Huggins (One Man Two Guv'nors), John Tavner, Colin Biggins, Joseph Sales, Don Poar, Joseph Adam Russell. Dunston. Martin Rayner and John Roberts

Set design is by David Thompson, who has had the challenge of constructing the weather maps which have a staring role in the play. The maps, which replicate the weather forecasts of D-Day weekend. are enormous There are five of them. Each map shows the weather pattern shifting as weather data is received from various weather stations. David has risen to the challenge and has

devised a strategy that will enable everyone in the audience to see each changing map clearly - even if sitting in the back of the Assembly Rooms.

The play creates tension and conflict, (but also lighter moments), none more so than the pressure carried upon the shoulders of Group Captain James Stagg, the Chief Allied meteorologist who has to advise Gen. Eisenhower if weather conditions allow for the planned invasion date. Eisenhower's 'weather buddy' US Col. Irving Krick insists that his prediction is the one that Eisenhower should choose. Stagg has personal

domestic pressure upon him. Eisenhower, of course, holds the fate of three hundred thousand service personnel in the balance waiting for the meteorologists to agree precisely what weather he can expect.

There is no doubt that this production will be informative and above all, entertaining. Dedham Players have a long tradition of producing excellent productions and Pressure will continue that tradition.

What a privilege to be here and to lead the music in this wonderful setting, to the glory of God.



What a Summer that was!

Well, we really had a mixed bag of weather thrown at us over the last couple of months didn't we! Unbelievably high temperatures and gusting winds often made gardening all the more difficult - I know I sometimes gave up as it just wasn't practical to do what a gardener's got to do!

So what's been a success? I'm pleased to report that *Brunnera* 'Dawson's White' lived up to expectations – you may remember I mentioned planting this earlier in the year as a possible replacement for the *Hosta* doilies!! Absolutely trouble-free, the large green and white leaves contrasted well against darker foliage and it will look even better next near as it 'clumps up' ready for dividing. Both this variety and its better-known cousin *B*. 'Jack Frost', are

ideal for the shady border.

But now we come to October when it's the optimum time for

moving trees and shrubs if you decide something really is in the wrong place, as many are *almost* dormant and will settle in before the winter. Try and prune out about a third of the branches/ stems (no more) in order to stimulate growth next spring. It's worth following a useful pruning tip from *Gardener's World* a while ago: "Remember the three D's: remove anything **D**ead,

Dying or Diseased". If you are moving anything heavy, always point your wheelbarrow in the direction you intend to take before you fill it up – then you won't have the difficulty of trying to turn around a heavy barrow with an awkward load!!

After cutting back all those hardy perennials that flowered earlier on and suffered in the heat, if you haven't done it yet, you can still divide the clumps: throw away the really old bits, replant the good pieces and perhaps relocate some to different parts of the garden if necessary. This will result in better growth next year, improved flowerpower and plants to give away. However, moving/dividing really only works well with plants that 'clump up' like astrantias, phlox, hostas, geums and so on. Don't forget to water everything well to settle in the roots; adding some mulch is always beneficial and makes the beds, borders or pots look thoroughly revived! But don't try and move plants with a deep tap root (e.g. eryngiums) as they don't like it: if you want to propagate these, take root cuttings instead.

There's no getting away from it but it's time to tackle tidying the shed or greenhouse while it's still possible to empty out what's inside, remove rubbish, give it good sweep, and clean the windows, ready for overwintering tender plants. Once the weather changes motivation for doing this can rapidly disappear!!

If you are emptying out summer containers, compost plants not worth keeping and the spent compost can go on the borders, although I often add some to the compost bins to improve the mix.

The good news from the gardening press suggests that as frosts *could* be later than usual this year, we *may* possibly experience a longer flowering period for some autumn stalwarts like *salvias*, *asters*, *dahlias* and *rudbeckias* — a welcome bonus indeed for this time of year.

As the summer is drawing to a close and weather is turning colder it's that time of year again to book in for your annual flu jab. For those eligible for the annual vaccination please phone the surgery to book

ARDLEIGH and DEDHAM

Tuesday 15 October, 2pm to 6pm For those working:

ARDLEIGH

Sat 19 October, 10am to 12:30pm We will be immunising the 2, 3 and 4 year olds against flu in the practice with the nasal spray and we will write to parents as soon as the centrally supplied NHS vaccine becomes available. Some primary school children may well receive the nasal spray immunisation at school.

Changes to Prescriptions@ Please be aware, new regulation from the EU, called the "Falsified medicines Directive" require your prescription to be collected within 7 working days from the dispensary. The directive is to ensure further safety of medication, but will add additional administration to the dispensary team.

WHAT IT MEANS FOR YOU:

If you do not pick up your medication strictly within the 7 days, the items will need to be destroyed which will be a cost to the NHS and you would need to order again and wait two further working days for your medication to be dispensed again. Hence, it is really important, now more than ever, that medications ordered are picked up in a timely manner and must be collected within 7 days of ordering.

HRT Shortages: HRT shortages are nationwide and have been widely publicised in the media. This can mean different HRT types are going in and out of stock and the dispensary and GPs cannot know for sure what is in, or out of stock at any given time. Please be aware this may mean we have to

switch your HRT to the next most similar and available type.

Car Park Ardleigh: We would like to remind you that the car park is for Blue Badge Holders or Parents with children under 5 years old only. There are only 3 parking spaces directly outside the Ardleigh surgery. Please use the village car park wherever possible, it is free and only a short walk from the practice. Please take care not to block or park in the staff car park, as this can block the Duty Doctor or Nurses and prevent them from getting out on their house calls.

New Website: Ardleigh Surgery has a new web site which is user friendly and has access to our registration forms, travel forms and contact information. On the website there are some useful links to self-help/self-referrals to different local services and pages explaining self-management of common conditions.






