Do you like filling in forms?

We all had to sit down recently and complete the census.

Censuses have been conducted since ancient times, and this one will be used to provide a snapshot of life in the UK and help form policy in the years to come.

2021's census was conducted primarily online – some progress.... do you remember the reams of paper in 2011?! And it's a vast improvement from the census known by Christians globally – the one where Mary and Joseph had to travel back to Joseph's birthplace to be counted.

This year's census, however, has reminded me of the book of Numbers. In Numbers I, God tells Moses to take something like a census, a recording of the names and numbers of the people. And then we have that as the fourth book of the Bible – a bit strange and not the first place to start reading the bible!

But counting things, counting individuals, listing their names – as we see in the book of Numbers – is a really good way to begin to focus on the *people* behind the stats we often throw around.

This year has been framed by numbers and statistics, the R number, hospital

admissions, numbers vaccinations, and mostly poignantly of all the numbers of people who have died within 28 days of a positive COVID test, 127,000 as I write this Viewpoint. That's a huge and disturbing number, and it's hard to get your head around it... and it only really starts to hit home when we hear the story of *one* such person. Those will be people known to us, or people whose stories have captured our attention.

It's hard to pray when faced with big numbers. And yet when we know someone's name, understand their story, it gets that bit easier. As we read big numbers, it will be easier to remember that behind each number is a person – because we are each one such person.

So when we hear big numbers moving forward – whether from the pandemic or the census or statistics about injustice and inequality – what would it mean not to be detached, not to let these things just go over our heads, but to remember that every single person behind the big numbers is just that – a person. An individual. Known by God, loved by Him. Someone we can pray for, someone to whom we can minister.

Why not take the opportunity to do that now.

One day a man was walking along the beach when he noticed a boy picking something up and gently throwing it into the ocean. Approaching the boy, he asked, "What are you doing?"

After listening politely, the boy bent down, picked up another starfish, and threw it back into the surf. Then, smiling at the man, he said....."I made a difference for that one."

Focus on Dedham Business

throughout 2020 & future plans for 2021

Jenny Hand, Director of the Munnings Art Museum describes the last twelve months in the life of the museum


There is nothing quite like the feeling of emptiness that invades you when the museum you run is void of visitors. The quietness is deafening. In more usual times the steady burble of voices, which starts in the hushed tones of enquiry and rises to sudden exclamations of discovery, is one of the joys of working in a special place like the Munnings Art Museum.

At the beginning of March 2020 the social media. Under the hashtag museum was all set for another exciting #showmethemunnings we set ourselves season riding high on the achievements the challenge of completing a nationwide

of the previous year; 2019 was the most successful in its six decade history when the museum exhibited 45 First World War paintings by Sir Alfred Munnings on loan from the Canadian War Museum.

As the pandemic took hold we had to cancel volunteer orientations, coach party bookings and planned events. Our new exhibition, *Yours With Love, AJ* sat silent as opening day came and went in the first lockdown. There was some good news, however, when our latest book, which inspired the exhibition, made it to the printer just in time. The book is the culmination of years of painstaking work to transcribe fifty-four letters written by Alfred Munnings to his new wife Violet in the early 1920s when he was away from home painting the portraits of wealthy patrons.

The constraints of lockdown brought a new wave of creativity from the cultural sector. Museums searched for ways to engage with people at home through social media. Under the hashtag #showmethemunnings we set ourselves the challenge of completing a nationwide



virtual tour of paintings by Sir Alfred Munnings in public museums by the end of lockdown. Each day we posted a different painting on our Facebook, Twitter and Instagram channels. The reaction was joyous and demonstrated how uplifting experiencing art can be, even when online. One follower commented, "I'm loving my daily Munnings. They make my day <3".

The art of Sir Alfred Munnings kept us uplifted and connected, too. We devised a series of bite-sized email updates about the new exhibition which enabled us to stay in touch with our volunteers, staff and trustees reinforcing our togetherness.

The opening of the museum at the beginning of September couldn't have been further away from that of the previous year: visitors snaked through the building in a thin, orderly line, their visits measured out by the new timedticket system. We welcomed them from behind our barriers of plastic, rope and cloth. But, some surprising opportunities came with all this strangeness. The slower, more deliberate pace gave visitors space and time to contemplate the artworks. Stewards embraced the challenge of stepping into new positions and stretching the boundaries of their previous roles.

The late summer also brought sunshine and colour. The cancelled workshop tutors and live-horse models from earlier in the year were re-booked and we soon had small, socially-distanced groups of budding and professional artists stirring the museum grounds into life again. Their paintings of an elegant side-saddle rider and two majestic Suffolk Punches were more than just artistic endeavours. They embodied new -found freedoms.

November dealt us all a fresh blow with the arrival of a second lockdown but the small team that was able to continue turned its focus towards Christmas mail orders. Our web shop was given a make -over and its new array of books, prints and gifts, including art-inspired facemasks, was promoted to our growing online following. The shop received an unprecedented volume of orders in December.







Key to this revamped retail-offer was moment when the silent rooms of Shallows Talk. Gardiner, it is an anthology of poetry, written by sixteen local poets, in response to the paintings of Alfred Munnings during our exhibition Munnings and the River when Tim was the museum's poet-in-residence.

As I write this we are energetically making plans for re-opening. Emails are pinging into the inbox from our keen to return volunteer stewards. Dates for summer art workshops are being discussed and tutors and models are checking their diaries. The exhibition Yours With Love, Al patiently awaits its visitors and we look forward to the

another new publication, entitled Where Castle House are filled once more with Edited by Dr Tim the sounds of carefree chatter.

For most of the country and for most people, the last year surely has been like a roller coaster. Full of ups and downs, unknowns around the corner, thrilling at times, terrifying at others. For the hospitality industry it has been no different. From locking down in March 2020 to unlocking in July, and then everything that followed, we have had to react and adapt to survive like never before. Some haven't survived despite best efforts.

And what a reopening on 4th July 2020. July and August were our busiest ever. It was clear you all missed eating out, socialising and getting back to normal. Foreign travel chaos resulted in full accommodation for us all the way through to the end of October. From the feedback we received prior to reopening, our aim was to deliver as normal an experience as possible while ensuring distancing was maintained and people felt safe. It was hard. A lot of people don't read signs. A lot ignore new rules. A lot didn't agree with them. And tell us! Levels of trade were unprecedented, especially the Monday-Wednesday for the EOHO scheme.

We didn't always get it right but we listened, adapted and improved. By and

large, the vast majority of our guests were fantastic and it was reassuring to receive such positive vibes from people. It's what we're here for.

The following months were unclear. It was impossible to plan beyond a week. I fear a lot of businesses like mine won't be there in the future. I fear a lot of our supply chain partners won't be there. From food and drink suppliers, to some professional services like recruitment and graphic design. I fear for many young people who rely on hospitality as their first job, second job or main job. A job that provides a lifetime of skills and experiences. No doubt we are dealing with an ethical dilemma where trade-offs will be made. No doubt decision making is very difficult.

For us for now, we crack on. Confident, if allowed, we can deliver what we're here for in a way that ensures you feel safe and most importantly, well looked after.

The last year has been tough but we have got through it. We've been busy decorating, repairing the front box gutter (hence the scaffolding) and doing some landscaping in the garden. We are only reopening our Garden Bar Friday-Sunday 12pm-6pm from 16 April-16 May - mainly due to the distance the garden is from the kitchen (food goes cold) and partly the unpredictable weather.

From 17 May, we will be fully open and are looking forward to getting back to normal.

We have our annual AI Festo Music & Beer Festival happening from 9-11 July (subject to government lifting restrictions on 21 June). Our team are raring to go and we really look forward to welcoming all our customers back.

I'd like to say a big thank you to every one who has sent lovely messages of support throughout the year, it has meant a lot to us all.


We strive to keep the shop feeling fresh and new products are always arriving, we introduced the ice cream bike last year and this will return once the warmer weather arrives!




Dedham's West End PART I

A popular subject for early postcards of Dedham was the view of the western end of the High Street with picturesque thatched cottages and a signpost set on a grassy triangle at the junction with the Stratford Road. Nowadays the hill leading out of the village towards Colchester is inaccurately named Shoebridge's but the name should be spelled Shoobridge after the family whose saddler's shop was in the cottage at the corner with a window looking down the High Street. John Shoobridge was followed by George who is recorded in the 1851 census as a harness maker living on the north side of Dedham Street. After he died the shop was taken over by another saddler labez Freeman (1854-1926), then passed to William Freeman who ran it as a general store and is recorded in the 1939 Register (of the population on the eve of war) as a clothing store salesman. Peggy Bullet told me that he had bicycles with carriers to take round his merchandise and used to go as far as Ipswich. He lived next door to the shop with his deaf and dumb brother Eddie who did shoe repairs and his unmarried sister who was in charge when he was out. I remember the shop when my sisters and I were children and my mother bought our Wellington boots there.

The cottage next door had housed another shop belonging to Jack Cade, a boot and shoe maker. His workshop was to one side and Ted Eley remembered him mending shoes in it. That must have been in the early years of the 20th century because by the 1920s Doug Howe had a bicycle and motor repair business there with a red corrugated iron shed next to the shop. He then moved to larger premises in Mill Lane; by the time I knew the cottage it had ceased to be a shop and Mrs Lock lived there. Ted told me that the thatched cottage beyond it just round the corner (now Little Thatch) was the home of Mr Hitchcock who rang the Market Bell before 8 o'clock on Tuesday mornings. It was stopped during WW2 but I still remember hearing it every week into the 1960s. Just along the Stratford Road was Rose Cottage, where the policeman PC Hatt lived and later the Edwards family who moved there from a cottage in Mill Lane. In 1911 it belonged to the Cottees (see Part 2). In the 1950s this little house, which showed alarming signs of sliding down the hill, was bought by Richard Dupont (1920-77), a painter of horses inspired by Sir Alfred Munnings. Dedham architect Raymond Erith restored it for him, buttressing the whole building with a studio addition right across the back.

Looking east from Freeman's Corner towards the centre of the village there were no other houses on the northern side of the High Street until 1935 when the present row of bungalows was built on an open field. In the early 1950s the Telephone Exchange moved from the back room of Mrs Hitchcock's shop in the village centre into the small single-storey building it still occupies.

Mabel Cottee who lived next door at Inverawe used its garden as an allotment until the extension was built in 1972.

A continuous line of old cottages and houses on the south side of the street included both homes and businesses. Old photographs show the cottages nearest the hill with large front windows dating from when they were shops. By 1950 they had become so derelict that the local authority condemned them for human habitation and they narrowly escaped demolition. They were saved by Kanty Cooper (1904-1993), daughter of John Paul Cooper, an Arts and Crafts designer and maker of metalwork and jewellery. She became a pupil of Henry Moore but abandoned a promising career as a sculptor to devote her life to working with refugees in many countries including Spain, Greece and Jordan. On her retirement she was looking for somewhere to live not far from her sister at Tolleshunt D'Arcy and bought these cottages to restore them. One end became Ramplins, her own small house and the remainder Penny Pot Cottage (named after the footpath along the back) which she let to a succession of tenants. The whole row had formerly been known as Cage Piece House and she built her garage on what had been the site of the village Cage, a vanished lock-up for vagrants, malefactors or drunks. She paid the Parish Council a shilling a year in rent for the use of the land and Ted and Connie Eley said that in the 1980s the Secretary Betty King used to go and collect it. Ted still remembered the Cage when it was used by Joe Osborne, the coach builder who

lived in the house next door (now Wheelwrights), to stack timber for seasoning. He had his workshop in the barn in front of Swanston Cottage, which was later restored by the eccentric builder Harry Humm and used by antique dealer Harry Griffiths as storage for his shop in the centre of the village. Their initials HH and HG can be seen built into the brickwork on either side of the wide door at the front.

Baking Recipes...

BANANA CRUMBLE FINGERS



Ingredients

- · 175 g (6 oz) Butter or margarine
- · 190 g (61/2 oz) Demerara Sugar
- 225g (8 oz) self-raising flour
- · 100g (4 oz) porridge oats
- 2 medium sized firm bananas peeled and mashed
- · 25g (I oz) sultanas

Method

Oven temperature Gas Mark 6 /200 C/180 C in fan oven. Cream together the butter and 175 g (6 oz) of the sugar. Add the flour and porridge oats, stir until the mixture forms rough breadcrumbs. Sprinkle half the mixture over the base of a lightly greased shallow 30×20 cm (12×8 inch) tin, lightly press down. Spread the mashed bananas over the base and top with the sultanas. Cover with the remaining crumble mixture and roughly level the surface. Bake for 25-30 minutes, or until golden. Allow to cool, then sprinkle over the remaining and cut into fingers. Makes 20 fingers.

Instead of bananas you could use, cooked apple, dates, cooked apricots, cooked blackberries, tinned fruit.



SMOKED HADDOCK FISHCAKES

Ingredients

- · 340 g smoked haddock, cooked in milk
- · 675 g potatoes, mashed with a little butter
- · I small onion or 2 spring onions
- · 85 g Cheddar cheese, grated
- · I egg, mixed with I tbsp milk
- I teacupful of breadcrumbs, mixed with 2 tbsp finely chopped parsley

Method

Heat the oven to 190°C. Flake the fish and mix it with the mash, onion and grated cheese, Season with salt and pepper. Form into 8 cakes, dipping each in the beaten egg and then the parsley breadcrumbs so they are well coated. Put on a piece of non-stick baking parchment on a baking tray and bake for

is looking to recruit two new Foundation Governors to the Governing Body

The Church of England is uniquely blessed by its continuing engagement with the education of our nation. The Chair of the Church's Education Division/National Society, Bishop John Pritchard, wrote in September 2013, "With nearly 5,000 Church of England schools, there is, naturally, an incredible mix of children who receive their education at our infant. junior, primary, middle, secondary schools academies. Whatever background. Church of England schools are there to provide a first class education, based on a commitment to draw out the full potential of each child."

The Governing Body is a vital part of the leadership of any school and Ofsted is increasing its focus on inspecting the quality of governance in schools. Their role in developing the school as a Church school is also scrutinised during the SIAMS (Statutory Inspection of Anglican and Methodist Schools) process. One of the key questions asked by SIAMS inspectors is "How effective are the leadership and management of the school as a church school"?

This means that governors should have a detailed and strategic knowledge of their school and it follows that governors,

Headteacher and staff should work as a united team, dedicated to realising a shared Christian vision for the school.

Foundation Governors play a specific role in ensuring the school's Christian character and their responsibilities will include

- * Preserving the links between Church, School and Diocese
- * Taking an active role in the SIAMS process
- * Ensuring that collective worship and religious education at the school are appropriately monitored
- * Ensuring that collective worship and religious education at the school follow the appropriate guidelines and/or syllabus
- * Bringing to the attention of the Diocesan Board of Education (DBE) any matters requiring their attention regarding the school
- * Ensuring that the Christian ethos of the school is encouraged throughout its community and is reflected in its policies and protocols, the curriculum and activities.
- * Ensuring that their own attitudes and behaviour in relation to the school reflect its Christian ethos.

The Drift: The works to re-surface the Drift and install bollard lights will be undertaken in May. We hope that they will be welcomed by pedestrians in the darker winter months.

The lights will have passive infrared sensors so that they only come on when pedestrians approach and will be on a timer so that they are not activated during the night.

Highways: Parking restrictions have been implemented at Lamb Corner by the North Essex Parking Partnership and parking is no longer allowed on the verges either side of the Birchwood Road exit at Lamb Corner.

We continue to monitor the progress of the installation of additional yellow lines along the B1029 and are still expecting them to be installed before the forthcoming summer season.

A recent flooding problem down Shoebridge Hill has now been investigated by ECC Highways and we await news on the proposed remedial action.

Play area: A new 'noughts and crosses' game has been installed to replace the defunct 'Simon Says' panel. Parents are

encouraged to continue to use the playground responsibly with their children in line with Covid guidelines posted on the gate. And please remember, no dogs are allowed in the fenced off area.

Meetings: The format of future meetings is as yet unclear, but face to face meetings are likely to be introduced soon. The date of the May meeting has yet to be announced, but must be held within fourteen days of the elections on May 6th. Details will be posted on the DPC website.

Clerk: DPC is pleased to announce that we have appointed a new Parish Clerk. Her name is Jayne Cole and she is an experienced Clerk with an impressive CV relevant to Parish Council work.

Thanks: Many current members of the Parish Council are stepping down after nine years of service. All of us would like to thank residents for their support and to thank our Colchester Borough Councillor Nigel Chapman for his help, our Essex County Councillor Anne Brown for her years of service to Dedham and our volunteer 'Webmaster' John Goldsbrough who has been responsible for our comprehensive and up to date website which is the envy of many parish councils.

A tapestry of colour

If April saw green shoots and buds bursting forth from soil, stem and branches, then May brings flowers blooming from almost every part of the garden. There are spots in the garden at this time of year where my eye is caught by a tapestry of foliage colour: where the rusted roof of my shed contrasts with the silver grey of a water butt, catches the new red leaves of a small acer, and complements the many shades of green in what I like to call my woodland border.

But that red and green corner of foliage is now enhanced elsewhere with colour too. Azaleas and rhododendrons are unfurling finger-like pink and red buds. Oriental poppies (Papaver orientale) 'Harlem' and 'Brilliant', and herbaceous and tree peonies are showing off their big blowsy, delicate flowers. Spiky Camassia leichtlinii and frothy cow parsley (Anthriscus sylvestris) provide blue and white contrast in the cottage border, and alliums complement the fresh green fronds of hardy male ferns (Dryopteris filix-mas). If you're lucky, your garden might have magnificent large clumps of blue Iris sibirica beside a pink Rosa 'Mary Rose'. All with the pale blue of self-seeded forget-me-nots (Myosotis sylvatica) sprinkled – seemingly never-endingly - at their feet.

As great as it all looks right now and as good as looking at it makes me feel, the work hasn't stopped. With the drier weather, there should be plenty of

opportunity to put your hoe to the soil once a week and cut the heads of weeds where they can shrivel up and die in the sunshine. Hoeing will tackle the annual weeds, but you'll still have to get down to soil level to fork perennial weeds out by hand.



I have a large evergreen hedge that separates my mini-orchard from the rest of the garden and this is a good time to give it a bit of a trim, but remember to check that there are no birds nesting as it's an offence to damage or destroy them. Fortunately, though I'm not sure what kind of hedge it is, it's not dense and is easy to look through it end to end and see what's inside. I just want to take the hedgetrimmer to one side of it, cutting it back a couple of inches and taking a

cutting will help it put on new growth. your gardens as much as I enjoy mine I'll do the other side next year, narrowing the whole hedge over two seasons. If you have a box (Buxus sempervirens) hedge, give it a trim too at the end of May to neaten it for summer

If you don't have a hedge to cut, late May is traditionally the time to give plants a 'Chelsea Chop'. It can make herbaceous perennials bushier and stagger flowering times but needs to be done when the plant is of a reasonable size. Try it on nepeta, phlox, asters, sedums and more by pruning about a third of the plant: either take the top third off everything or every third stem of one plant or a third of a larger group.

I love Aubrieta 'Red Cascade' which has been flowering since March, bringing eye-catching colour to the borders ahead of the daffodils and tulips, but as it goes over, a quick trim will encourage fresh growth and flowers.

The allotment is coming on with plenty of time spent tidying it up after Christmas, but I'll need to protect strawberry plants with straw to help keep weeds down and lift the berries off the soil and with netting to keep the birds off. In my mini-orchard, I need to hang pheromone traps in my plum and apple trees to monitor and hopefully reduce the activity of moths that can result in larvae (yes, maggots) in fruit when it comes to harvest time.


