Dear Friends

We have had a generally warm, dry spring and as you read this, the summer days are nearing their maximum length at the summer solstice – June 21st.

I rejoice in these long warm days especially, as my birthday is very close to this date. My daughter was born very near to the winter solstice, with the coldest and darkest days, and this is often a topic of conversation that comes up in our birthday celebrations, whether a summer BBQ or a celebratory tea huddled around a cosy fire indoors.

It is mistaken to think the solstice is a whole day. According to the Royal Museums Greenwich website, where the Royal Observatory is (rmg.co.uk) the solstice is an actual moment in time.

They say the Summer Solstice is 'in reality an exact moment in time that falls upon that day. This moment comes when whichever hemisphere you're in is most tilted towards the Sun.' In 2025 the summer solstice will occur on Saturday 21st June at 03.42 BST (02.42 GMT).

Pentecost, or 'Whitsun' as it used to be known, falls this year on Sunday 8th June. It is always 50 days after Easter Sunday and is recognised by many to be the birthday of the church. But just like the Solstice the birth of the church was not a day but a moment.

In Chapter 2 of the Acts of the Apostles in the New Testament, the first day of Pentecost is described with the promised gift of the Holy Spirit. It was the moment that the fearful and somewhat confused followers of Jesus became emboldened and empowered in living life in a new way.

Despite the threats and dangers of persecution, these first followers of Christ – who were soon to be called Christians – changed their outlook and values to live in the light of God's radical love for every person.

In Acts, 2 verse 42, it says they lived 'devoted to the apostles' teaching and fellowship, to the breaking of bread and the prayers. The church has been seeking to do this in the best way they can for some 2000 years now. It has not always succeeded. But then the church is made up from people who recognise they are sinners and fall short of the glory of God (Romans 3 verse 23).

At Pentecost this year, in church we will celebrate again the gift of the Holy Spirit as God's presence with us. The Spirit who convicts us where we fall short; brings forgiveness through Christ's death and resurrection; and empowers us to live better and more faithful lives.

You are warmly welcome to join us in church for Pentecost. Come and learn with us about the amazing grace of God and his Spirit. Details of our services can be found as usual elsewhere in the magazine.

BOOK REVIEW

Be Still - Brian Heasley

What a great title for a book about Prayer! I've been looking for a book to encourage me into daily good practice for a time and this relatively easy book to read has given me the necessary "tools" to enable me to develop a better daily prayer practice.

Brian Heasley uses both every day situations as well as biblical illustrations to relate how in our very busy lives, it is possible to find times to "be with God."

He encourages the reader to find a quiet space to develop a relationship with God. It could be in a special space where we live; a chair in a room in which we can find a regular time to sit and be still with God, or it could be whilst taking a daily walk that we find the right space to let go of our busy lives and to turn to God for daily renewal in him.

Brian talks about his own problems and how he found God after very difficult early life experiences, which are threaded into the book, helping the reader to feel God is very approachable; not a being who is unaware of the problems we all encounter, but someone who in Jesus has experienced life's joys and difficulties. Jesus, we read in the Bible, prayed daily for guidance from God in living his life and Brian has created within this book a very real, personal God who is there for us all, and is waiting for us to meet up with him and develop our own relationship with him.

"Be Still" has helped me to realise the importance of finding time for a daily interaction with a living Lord, and encouraged me to be aware that I can find time and space within my daily life to develop a relationship with a God who cares about me. Brian in his book "Be Still" has encouraged me to feel that God is accessible and given me ways to develop a daily interaction with Him in a narrative that is both practical and supportive.

I would recommend reading this book as it has helped me to approach prayer in a positive down to earth manner, making me realise that a daily time (no matter how short) with our Lord is of importance to Him and to me too.

Saturday 10th May saw the Service of Dedication of the new organ, and the much anticipated recital by Jonathan Scott.

The Dedication of the organ was the culmination of many years of hard work, and to set it apart for the worship of God was indeed a very emotional moment for those involved in the project.

It was wonderful to have Bishop Roger to lead the service, and the augmented choir sang beautifully, accompanied in the anthem by Andrew Caskie, (who brought some of the Nicholson team with him).

Jonathan Scott gave a most uplifting evening with a recital which showcased the organ spectacularly well. Music by Mozart, J.S. Bach, Widor, Saint-Saens etc, with a nod to the VE Day celebrations, music by Holst and Elgar was included in the programme.

Jonathan introduced each piece in a wonderfully engaging way, his stunning performance was projected onto a big screen so that the audience could watch the mastery of his hands and feet, which was the source of much amazement to many.

Thanks to the team from Eye Parish Church (with whom the organ group have worked closely throughout the project) for the loan of the screen and

projector.

All in all, it was a dazzling evening, Jonathan was clearly very impressed with the organ, saying that it was hard to believe that such a relatively small organ with just 27 stops could produce such a wealth of sounds. Testament indeed to the fine work of Mr J J Binns in 1902 in making the pipes, and to Nicholson & Co for their fine new organ.

It was indeed an evening that will live long in the memory of those lucky enough to be present.

We look forward to welcoming Jonathan back in the near future.

In the Presence of Exile ... When God Becomes the Homeland

When a person is caught between truth and emotion, questions swirl within - questions too heavy to speak aloud, yet impossible to ignore: "Why me? Why is all this happening to me? Why did I lose my freedom? And what is freedom really?"

In those moments, the mind becomes a shattered mirror, reflecting fragments of a reality too painful to bear. One tries to escape... to forget. Some turn to substances - drugs, alcohol, pills - seeking relief, but finding only more emptiness.

And when all paths seem closed, one road remains forever open: the one that leads to God. A person begins to speak to their Lord - as a friend, a father, a brother - searching for answers in silence, in prayer, in the stillness of the soul.

Outwardly, nothing may seem to have changed, but in truth, God is there, He has never left. He teaches, guides, sends signs - messages that only a heart willing to see can recognise.

I longed for my homeland, for Africa - for the scent of its soil, the warmth of its sun. I asked God, "Will I ever see it again?"

Instead of a direct answer, I met a stranger - someone who felt oddly familiar. For the first time, I wasn't shy. We spoke, and he invited me to a church.

I entered the church as an outsider... and walked out reborn. I prayed, I danced, I sang. There, I found the answers I had been searching for: peace, connection, a sense of belonging. I met a

who prayed for me and welcomed me as if I were her own son.

And every time I visit a church, no matter where it is or how different, I find the same peace. It's as if its walls radiate divine energy - a quiet whisper from God reminding me that everything will be alright. These spaces become sacred vessels of reassurance, charging the soul with faith and calm.

Each visit becomes a journey back into myself. Though I remain a journalist by nature, always inquisitive and asking more, I now know one truth for certain: God has always been with me. He is my homeland.

A word of wisdom:

Every path that leads through faith ends in peace. And no door opened to God ever fails to let in the light - even when the heart is lost in the darkness of exile.

ARDLEIGH SURGERY NEWS

Staff Updates

In April, we were pleased to welcome two new GP Partners: Dr Kelechi Anumnu and Dr Michelle O'Carroll. Historically, Ardleigh and Dedham have operated successfully as a three-partner practice. However, due to the significant increase in demand for GP services, we have expanded to a four-partner model to improve resilience and service delivery.

March also marked the retirement of Dr Lisa Gladwin and Sister Zoe Lacey. Both have made outstanding contributions to the practice and will be greatly missed by patients and staff alike. Sister Harrison will be on maternity leave from the 1st of June 2025. We wish her all the best during this special time. **Blood Tests**

At present, we are unable to offer blood test appointments at the surgery due to our phlebotomist being on long-term sick leave. A temporary replacement had been arranged, but they have since decided to retire from the NHS. In the meantime, patients requiring blood tests are being directed to the phlebotomy clinic at the local walk-in centre. We appreciate your understanding and patience during this time.

Anima Online Triage

We would like to thank all our patients for embracing our new online triage system, Anima, which launched in late January. So far, 4,800 patients out of our 7,500 registered population have signed up, and many are actively using the system.

While Anima has helped streamline appointment triaging, demand remains extremely high. On Mondays, we regularly receive over 120 requests in the first four hours of opening.

Zero Tolerance Policy

We regret to report a recent increase in unacceptable behaviour towards our staff, including shouting, swearing, and even physical aggression.

Our reception team plays a vital role under very challenging circumstances, and such conduct will not be tolerated. We kindly ask all patients to treat our staff with the respect they deserve.

Medication Requests

We regularly receive multiple requests for various medications. Please be aware that your GP is not authorised or qualified to prescribe all medications available.

Two of the most common requests are for weight loss medications and ADHD medications.

- Weight Loss Injections: These are currently not available for general prescription through the GP, unless they are specifically indicated for the management of uncontrolled diabetes.
- ADHD Medications: We are no longer continuing prescriptions for ADHD medications. This is because adult ADHD prescribing has now been transferred to the Suffolk GP Federation, and care for children has been transferred to GPPC (GP Primary Choice).

Patients currently receiving ADHD medication through the surgery will be gradually transferred to these dedicated services. We understand this may be frustrating, but these changes are necessary to ensure patients receive the most appropriate specialist care.

Dedham Parish Council: Annual Residents Meeting - May 12th 2025.

Councillor Bourn, Chair of the Parish Council, presented the annual report outlining the Council's activities over the past year. A financial report was also delivered by Councillor Harrison. Both reports are available on the Parish Council website.

Following the reports, an open forum was held, allowing residents to raise any issues of concern.

Topics raised by residents included: The proposed dog park at the Munnings Museum, the condition of kerbsides on Crown Street, Outdoor tables and chairs used by businesses that obstruct access for wheelchair users and those with guide dogs and Parking issues on the High Street and Mill Lane beyond the bridge.

There was also concern regarding the Conservative Party newsletter Dedham Matters, particularly about conflicting information related to parking proposals. The Council's information from NEPP (North Essex Parking Partnership) appears to contradict statements made in the newsletter. Councillor Bourn will write to the relevant councillors regarding this issue and their absence from recent meetings.

Councillors assured residents that all points raised will be investigated, and updates will be provided at the June Council meeting.

Concern was expressed that for the third successive Council meeting there was no report from represented councillors for Dedham on Colchester City Council (CCC) and Essex County Council (ECC)

Parish Plan discussion.

The Council agreed to the proposal to deliver a Parish Plan and that initially the Parish Council would act as the steering group for the plan.

It was hoped that the development of the plan would take no more than 6 months.

Finance.

All proposed financial transactions approved and Council agreed to sign the Annual Governance forms which review the effectiveness of the system of internal control for the Internal Auditor.

Planning Report.

From June a new Planning Group will be in operation to which members of the public are welcome and the first such meeting will be held at 6pm on on Monday 2nd of June in the Duchy Barn

Planning Applications.

The Council noted that one application included a comment from a neighbour. In its response, the Council will simply acknowledge this comment.

No other planning applications received comments from the Council.

A late application concerning a proposed retail development on Birchwood Road, adjacent to the hotel, was received. It was agreed that this will be discussed at the next meeting, subject to time availability.

Litter Pick.

The Council welcomed the proposal from the church youth group to institute a regular litter pick in the village.

Parking.

Report was given on a recent meeting with North Essex Parking Partnership (NEPP) and was noted that there was no evidence to substantiate the comments made in the Dedham Conservative newsletter regarding possible changes to parking in the High Street and Crown Street.

Infrastructure.

It is planned to tidy up the main car park. The Council are concerned that at present NEPP does not appear to have the budget to undertake the necessary repainting of the yellow lines in the village.

Council agreed to tree work on the playing fields and also work on the exterior of the Sports Pavilion with a view that part of the cost for this is covered by community funds from Colchester City Council.

Communications.

Report was given on progress of planned new website.

MIDSUMMER'S HERE

June is the month of roses, and my garden is filled with a huge range from clusters of small white double flowers to obelisks clothed in single pink climbers. There are roses on the front of the house and over an arch as you walk to the front door. Every border and bed has at least one rose, ranging from white to pink to red, from cream to yellow. With so many, I will be busy deadheading them throughout the summer to keep them blooming.



The roses are complemented by early large-flowered clematis in pink and deep purple, as well as alliums, foxgloves, delphiniums and the white forms of valerian and rosebay willowherb.

My bees are going mad on the pyracantha hedge that floats above one of my fences. As we approach the longest day of the year, there's plenty to do and

even time to relax and enjoy the fruits of our labours.

The best way to deadhead your roses is to use your secateurs and cut right back down the stem to the next leaf or bud. This will prompt a side shoot to grow and eventually another flower. You can deadhead other plants of course, both annuals and perennials. The production of flowers is part of how flowers reproduce. When the flowers die, they leave behind seeds (essentially the plant's eggs) from which more flowers are born.

Once seeds are produced, the plant thinks its job is done and has no further need to produce flowers. Deadheading therefore keeps the plant in a state of perpetually giving birth (flowering). I think I might be a bit mad about that if I were a plant and is probably why I come in from the garden covered in thorn scratches.



Magnificent Wisteria

Although some plants will only ever flower once, deadheading will also work on asters, campanulas, delphiniums, daylilies and scabious. It is especially important for sweet peas, which is why you should pick as many as you can whenever you can so that seed pods aren't produced.

I love aubrieta for its vibrant purple flowers, which look great against late flowering daffodils. It offers early nectar

and pollen for my bees, but by now it can be looking a bit tatty so needs cutting back. Lightly trim your aubrieta if it still forms a quite neat mound, but if it's straggly with an almost bald centre then it needs to be cut back harder to within a couple of inches of the base of the plant. Make sure to keep it well watered after cutting back and it will put on fresh foliage within a few weeks.

Cut back perennial Oriental poppies too after flowering, taking them back to ground level. Water – you can feed them with poultry pellets or tomato food if you like – and you'll get new foliage and perhaps even some new blooms. Hardy geraniums (not the tender pelargoniums) can also be chopped back now too.

My wisteria plants have been magnificent this year, and their powerful scent seems to reach all round the garden. Once they've finished showing off though, it's time for their first prune of the year this month. Wisteria produces its beautiful racemes of purple, white or pink flowers on new growth, so to encourage lots of flowers next year, I'll need to cut back the whippy new shoots that have grown this season. Prune back to the sixth bud from the base of the shoot. If you're not sure, cut lightly as you'll do a second prune in winter when it's easier to see what you're doing.

I put some garden pinks (Dianthus) around the beds last year and they are

beginning to bulk up so I can take some softwood cuttings. Just pull a non-flowering shoot with four pairs of leaves off the plant using your thumb and forefinger. Use a sharp knife to cut below the lowest pair of leaves to make a cutting 5-10cm long. Remove the lower leaves and dip the base of the cutting in hormone rooting powder or gel. Make a hole in a pot of compost, insert the cutting so the lowest pair of leaves is just above the top of the soil, then water. Pop



it in a propagator or under a plastic bag and place somewhere warm, and it should root within 2-4 weeks.

Although it can be a busy time in the garden right now, don't forget to take time to soak up the summer sun this month.

As this year marks the 200th Anniversary of the Dedham Primary School, we have looked at what was happening in Dedham 200 years ago in 1825. This is just a selection of items from the British Newspaper Archive using the search term 'Dedham'. The text was extracted from the images using Al.

Suffolk Chronicle - Saturday 01 January 1825

Marriage - On Christmas-day, Mr. Edward Hoy, of Dedham, Essex, to Miss Bird, of the same place.

Bury and Norwich Post - Wednesday 26 January 1825

DEDHAM ASSEMBLY. THE THIRD ASSEMBLY will be on FRIDAY, February 4, 1825. Any Person wishing to become a Subscriber, must send his or her Name previously to the Stewards. H. N. JARRETT, Esq. The Rev. M. VERNON.

Tickets will be delivered and Subscriptions received at the Sun Inn during the week, or at the Room on the Morning of the Assembly.

Essex & Herts Mercury - Tuesday 01 February 1825

During the night of yesterday week the hen-house of Mr. John Eagle, of Little Bromley, was robbed of twelve fowls. The same night Mr. Bloomfield, of Dedham, had a quantity of barley stolen from out of his granary. Four men, named William Winney, Thomas Winney, James, Josselyn, and James Stuart, have since been apprehended, and committed for both robberies.

Ipswich Journal - Saturday 05 February 1825

Commitments to Chelmsford Gaol, by Thomas Nunn and Thomas Nunn, jun. Esgrs. On the 26th ult. David Steward and James Josselyn, both of Lawford, labourers, on suspicion of stealing 14 chickens and 3 hens, the property of Mr. Jas. Eagle, of Little Bromley. D. Steward also charged with stealing a copper boiler, and 2 copper boiler lids from Mr. Gledhill, innkeeper, of Dedham. Abraham Hicks, Daniel Hicks and James Garrad, by the same Magistrates, on suspicion of stealing 8 pigs from Mr. Carrington, of Little Bromley, and Henry Holmes in conjunction with Abraham Hicks and James Garrad, on suspicion of stealing 5 pigs from Mr. James Girling, of Little Bentley. Hicks and Garrad were also charged with stealing 4 pigs from Mr. Girling, and Holmes for stealing a pig from Mr. Hicks, Layham. Wm. Winney, the elder was committed on suspicion of stealing a pig from Mr. Sizer, of Great Oakley; and also a coomb of barley from Mr. Blomfield, of Dedham.

1825

A BUTLER AND VALET

WANTED immediately, in a Gentleman's Family, at Dedham, in Essex, where a Footman is kept. He must understand his business perfectly (brewing included), bear an unexceptionable character, and be disposed to render himself generally useful. — Apply to Mr. Powell, butcher, at Dedham.

Saturday last died at Dedham, Essex, much respected in her 73rd year, Grace, widow of the late John Marratt, Esq. of the Grove.

Suffolk Chronicle - Saturday 09 April 1825

Death - On Saturday last, Mr. John Hitchcock, of Dedham, Essex, aged 77.

Suffolk Chronicle - Saturday 27 August 1825

CRICKET.—Last week a match of Cricket was played at Dedham between eleven of the Dedham Club (three only of whom are under the age of 21) and the youths at Dedham School, which was won by the latter with eleven wickets to go down. So confident were the Dedham Club of victory, that they entered the field with ribbons in their hats. This was not merely an ostentatious, but, as it happened, a premature display.—After this game, another was played (a single innings) and the School boys beat them again, with one wicket to go down.
