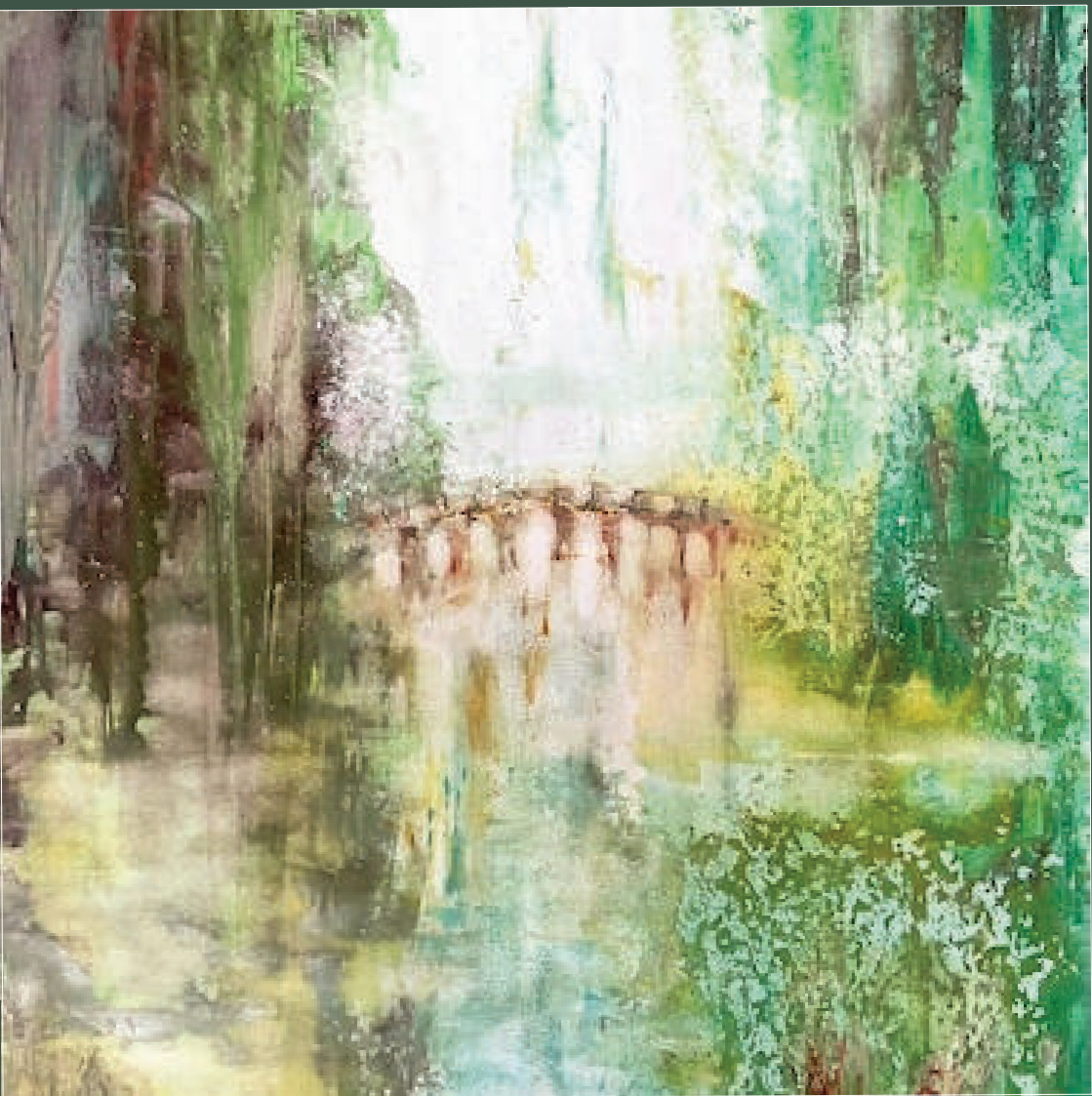

Dear friends,

I hope you've all enjoyed some time away over the summer break and, for those of you with children beginning a new year at school, a new course at university or maybe even a new job at this time, may things begin well!

Our country has recently begun a new chapter with Andy Burnham becoming Prime Minister. Regardless of our political convictions, Christians are encouraged to pray for those in positions of authority (1 Timothy 2:1-2). Leading a nation is no easy task and those who carry such responsibility need much wisdom, constant humility and supernatural strength.

Leadership is a perennial theme in the Bible. I've recently been reading through the book of Judges in the Old Testament. It's a fascinating book, but no "easy read!" In it, time and again we encounter leaders who, despite moments of courage and faith, also have deep, deep flaws. Gideon trusted God wonderfully at first, yet later led people astray. Samson was blessed with remarkable strength, but too often made foolish choices. Jephthah's rash decisions brought tragedy right when blessing was in view. The final verse of Judges sums the book up: *"In those days Israel had no king; everyone did as they saw fit"* (Judges 21:25). It's not simply saying that Israel needed a king – it points us to a much deeper need. We all long for someone who will lead with perfect wisdom, unwavering goodness and unfailing love.

That is exactly who we find in Jesus. Jesus is the King we have always needed.

He doesn't lead by seeking power for Himself but by giving Himself for others. He knows us completely, yet loves us deeply. He is perfectly just, wonderfully compassionate and utterly trustworthy.

When we place our lives in His hands, we discover forgiveness, peace and a sure hope for the future. Under His loving rule, people don't merely survive – they thrive, becoming the people God created them to be.

So this month, let's pray for Andy Burnham and for all those who lead us at every level. But more than that, let's look to Jesus, the one leader who will never fail us.

Whatever changes this world may bring, His kingdom is secure, His promises are certain and His invitation is open to each and every one of us.

A NEW FACE FOR LEPROSY: INSPIRING EXHIBITION IN DEDHAM

Visitors to Dedham Church have been discovering a powerful new perspective on one of the world's oldest diseases through the New Face for Leprosy exhibition, by leprologist Professor Diana Lockwood and photographer Tom Bradley.

The free exhibition showcased striking photography and personal stories from people affected, who have received treatment and support from Lepra's projects in India. The images seek to challenge the myths and stigma surrounding leprosy while celebrating the resilience of those affected. The exhibition ran from 7–28 June 2026 and welcomed visitors from across Essex and beyond.

For more than 100 years, Lepra has worked to diagnose, treat and support people affected by leprosy and other neglected tropical diseases in India and Bangladesh. Although leprosy is curable, stigma continues to have a devastating impact, often leading to discrimination, isolation and poverty.

The Dedham exhibition encouraged visitors to look beyond the disease and see the individuals behind the diagnosis. Through compelling portraits and real-life stories, it highlighted the importance of early diagnosis, treatment and community support, while demonstrating the life-changing difference that charitable donations can make.

Lepra extends its sincere thanks to everyone who visited, volunteered or helped promote the exhibition.

Together, supporters are helping to build a future where no one is defined by leprosy and everyone has the opportunity to live with dignity, hope and inclusion.

September 13th

The Deanery choir will be singing at **St Georges Church, Great Bromley CO7 7TS** at the 11am communion service. The anthem they will sing will be 'Rejoice in the Lord alway' by John Redford. John Redford was a major English composer, organist, and dramatist of the Tudor period.

From about 1525 he was organist at St Paul's Cathedral. He was choirmaster there from 1531 until his death in 1547. Many of his works are represented in the Mulliner Book.

Redford is notable as one of the earliest composers, rather than improvisers, of organ music, having notated a significant quantity of keyboard music, all of it liturgical in function based on plainchant melodies; a few vocal works by him also survive.

As he held the post of Almoner and master of the Choristers, Redford was responsible for the arrangement of the choristers performances, including writing and directing plays and interludes.

September 27th

The Deanery choir will be singing at **St Mary's Church, Great Bentley CO7 8QG** at the 6.30pm Choral evensong service. They will sing the Magnificat and Nunc dimittis setting by Charles Villiers Stanford and the anthem 'Lead me Lord' by Fred Bock.

Sir Charles Villiers Stanford was an Anglo-Irish composer, music teacher, and conductor of the late Romantic era. Born to a well-off and highly musical family in Dublin, Stanford was educated at the University of Cambridge before studying music in Leipzig and Berlin. He was instrumental in raising the status of the Cambridge University Musical Society, attracting international stars to perform with it.

THE KNITTED BIBLE

In August, a friend and I went to an exhibition at St Mary's Church, East Bergholt to which she said "would blow my mind!" It certainly did, both in the sheer number of beautifully knitted pieces as well as the presentation of biblical scenes presented in easily understood 3D formats.

We were told that the exhibition would be in the church a few more days and then would be sent elsewhere in the country – we understand there is a waiting list of over a year if we wanted to have the display in our church in Dedham.

I found this piece of information about the Knitted Bible on line, taken from the Mail and written by Sue Bosomworth.

The Knitted Bible on Tour

What started out way back in 2008 as a knitted display of "The Last Supper" by the crafters of St George's United Reform Church in Hartlepool, became over a period of time, a mammoth undertaking of creating 36 scenes depicting some of the best-known stories from both the Old and New Testaments. Complete with scenery, characters, and a printed reference to the chapter and verses of the Bible, each scene fully gives the essence of the story, bringing it to life in a way that is easily understood.

I returned to take another friend who as a keen knitter was able to appreciate the complexity involved in producing the figures or other pieces involved in each of the Biblical scenes.

Here are some photos I took of a number of the of the Biblical scenes which I hope will bring the Knitted Bible to life for you all if you were not able to visit and see this wonderful display.

Noah's Ark:



So much detail – I loved the two ladybirds displayed on a leaf!

The story of Joseph and his brothers:



His amazing technicolour dream-coat !

The wedding at Cana:



Notice the wine goblets full of red wine after Jesus had changed the water into wine.

Blessing the Children:



Please see the prayer that goes with the story.

Palm Sunday:



The Bible story is written out on a card; look at Jesus so wonderfully depicted on the donkey.

The parable of the Good Shepherd:



I found this scene so moving; so many knitted sheep in the flock, reminded me so much of mankind; each of us so different in so many ways. Jesus the Good Shepherd; there for us all, loving us and taking care of us, noticing and rescuing one of us to the fold - said so much to me, in such a simple representation of a beautiful Bible story.

FINDING HOME: FROM CANADA TO DEDHAM



When I moved from Canada to England, I expected many differences. Canada and England are both places where people are generally friendly and polite, but they are different in unique ways.

Canada is a country of incredible space and wilderness. Which means that houses are built spread out. You needed a car to get almost anywhere because of the huge open spaces. So the mail is not delivered to your door. It was a seven minute walk (or one minute drive) to get our mail, which was at the end of the housing estate in a cluster mailbox. It would sometimes feel isolating, though nature was always nearby.

One of my favourite Canadian stories happened when I was at the vet. Another pet owner arrived and mentioned that a bear had wandered into his garden that morning. He had gone outside to try to scare it away and was annoyed it wasn't hunting season so he couldn't shoot it. He thought the bear might come back because new houses were being built in the area that had previously been the bear's habitat. Then he joked, "Well, if I don't make my appointment next week, you'll know the bear got me!"

The British famously love to "talk" about the weather; in Canada you "live" through weather. In the year before we moved to England, we experienced a

major ice storm in Ontario and Quebec. Freezing rain coated everything, bringing down trees and power lines, and many people (including us) were without electricity for days. In the summer smoke from Quebec wildfires travelled south, turning the sky ashy. I remember going to work and I could smell the smoke! Canadians need to be prepared for mother nature. But, the one thing I don't miss are the mosquitoes!

England feels different because of all the human history. It's fascinating to me that the buildings and houses have been there for hundreds of years. One of the things I love about Dedham St Mary's is sitting in the church and reading the names around me on the gravestones, the pews and the memorials. Some carry the names people who lived here long before the country of Canada existed. Sometimes I wonder: will my name one day be written on one of those stones? It is a slightly strange and perhaps morbid thought, but I think it is really a question about belonging.

I recognise that Dedham has already given so much to my family. Through the youth group, children's church and the welcome we have received. That is one of the things I have come to appreciate most about living near Dedham. Canada will always be part of who I am. I miss the lakes, the forests and the wilderness. But England, and particularly this part of Essex, has become home. It is a place where my family is building new memories while becoming part of a great community. Also, I don't mind the weather!

DEDHAM PARISH COUNCIL MEETING REPORT – MONDAY, 6th July 2026

Bladder Cancer

A resident raised concerns about evidence of bladder cancer in the village. It was noted there was no evidence of problems with water quality in the village. The Council agreed to follow up by contacting hospital's oncology department

Tables Outside the Old Bakery

Concerns were raised about alleged unlawful trading involving tables at the Old Bakery. It was clarified that the tables were being used temporarily for staff welfare purposes due to the hot weather.

Highway and Footpath Maintenance

Several residents raised ongoing issues with potholes around the village. Several highway and footpath maintenance issues were discussed. A number of potholes around the villages were mentioned and it was noted the Council are aware of these and have been reported to Essex Highways. There was also concern about some footpaths not being cut back on a regular basis. This is being investigated.

Sports Club/Parish Council

There was a very productive and constructive meeting held between the Sports Club and the Parish Council. Cllr Bourn summarised the meeting and there had been discussions of future developments of the sports pavilion.

Football on Sundays

Cllr Bourn and two other parish councillors met with residents regarding the proposal of football on Sundays. It was noted that the residents who attended the meeting raised objections to Sunday football.

These included foul language, parking problems, clashes with church services and potential impact on general use of the playing fields.

Although the Parish Council owned the land upon which the football was held, there was no formal agreement. It was agreed that the Council contact the Football Club regarding the matter requesting they cease playing on Sundays whilst consultation is taking place to clarify on status of rights of clubs to play on Sundays.

River/Meadows update

Cllr Bourn summarised the meeting of the Dedham stakeholder meeting (40 people) which addressed ongoing issues concerning use of the meadows beyond the 28 days legally permitted time, parking in the area, anti-social behaviour and jumping off the bridge.

The landowner had exceeded his 28 days and had been informed of this but there is likely to be an appeal. There has been increased parking warden presence in recent weeks.

A Meeting had been held with Suffolk and Essex Police to discuss anti-social behaviour and young people jumping off the bridge. Meetings are also planned with Suffolk Highways to discuss options for making it difficult to jump off the bridge.

Concern was expressed that although members of the Council and local residents were aware of numerous anti-social behaviour incidents, both Suffolk and Essex Police had very few recorded incidents.

The Council welcomed the work undertaken by the River Stour Trust on the banks of the Mill Pond. It was agreed to send a donation of £100 for their work

Play Equipment on Sports Field

Following previous discussions with the council, a group of local parents conducted a consultation regarding the development of the village play park. A report was presented of the comments from residents.

It was highlighted that the play area is highly valued, heavily utilised, and considered crucial for local children's development. The Council formally thank the parents involved and support the report's general recommendations, which include adding more seating for parents.

In order to progress these discussions, it is proposed to establish a dedicated Task and Finish Group which included 2–3 Council members and local parents.

Padel tennis discussion update

Work on preparing a feasibility study for this proposal is ongoing.

Internal Audit Report

The report had been received with a number of recommendations which are being followed up.

Planning report

The planning group reported on discussions on recent planning applications and stated they had no major comments on any of the proposals.

Infrastructure

Trading Bay policy for Royal Square

It was agreed that the trading bay is utilised for four days (Monday to Thursday) and on Friday for local voluntary groups to utilise the square for community purposes only. The usage of

the bays would be from 8.30 am to 8pm. A formal consultation process would need to take place before this can be progressed. Also it would require NEPP to monitor the usage of the bays

Service Level Agreement for Youth Club

Council agreed to funding agreement with the Youth Club.

Vandalism of playground equipment and RoSPA report

There has been some vandalism of the climbing tunnel in the play area which has been followed up and temporary repair undertaken.

Cycle Racks

There had been requests for additional cycle racks in Royal Square but the space options were limited. It was agreed that it might be worth talking to the pubs in the village to see if they can help with cycle racks.

Mobile Phone coverage

There had been a meeting with other parish councils affected by the lack of signal with Sir Bernard Jenkin/Cllr Rowe. This is being followed up.

Water on Castle Hill

Some of the problems are a result of roots of the trees. Highways are being contacted.

Litter Bin for outside Co-op/Essex Rose

The Council agreed to look into re-locating one the bins to the High Street.

PUBLIC FORUM REGARDING USE OF DEDHAM PLAYING FIELDS ON SUNDAYS

The public and other interested bodies were invited to discuss the playing of football matches on Sundays and practice matches during the summer. Residents gave their opinions on the suggestions of Sunday football. These were summarised as follows:

General Concerns:

Several residents expressed objections and concerns regarding the proposed football activities, particularly the introduction of Sunday football and the associated impacts on the local community.

Noise and Disturbance:

A resident living adjacent to the playing field objected to the level of noise, stating it has a direct impact on their property and garden.

Other residents also raised concerns about excessive shouting and offensive language during matches, distinguishing this from the normal noise associated with children's sports.

Concerns were also expressed about the effect of this behaviour on nearby families, and children using the playground, and those wishing to enjoy other recreational facilities such as cricket and tennis.

Traffic, Parking and Access:

A resident speaking on behalf of 11 households (representing 18 residents) from Southfields and The Drift highlighted concerns over access to Southfields during match days, parking pressures, and obstruction of emergency vehicle access. The owner of a nearby field, previously used for overflow parking by football clubs, opposes its use for football parking and may withdraw permission for all future parking arrangements of the other clubs if football parking continues.

Process and Communication:

Concerns were raised regarding the transparency of the decision-making process. Questions were also raised about interim football arrangements that appeared to have been agreed without the Parish Council's knowledge, including matches that had already taken place. Residents called for future discussions and agreements to be held openly and in public.

Sunday Football:

Many residents stated their opposition to Sunday football, citing the village's tradition of maintaining Sundays as a quieter day.

Football Club Developments:

Reference was made to announcements by Dedham Football Club, including the merger with another team and the recruitment of players for Saturday and Sunday football. A timeline of these developments was outlined, with concerns expressed that changes were progressing ahead of formal community consultation.

Residents stressed that the playing field is a shared community asset intended for a range of recreational activities, including walking, picnics, and informal recreation, and should remain

accessible and enjoyable for all members of the community.

Comments in Support of Sunday Football:

Some residents commented that they had no objection to Sunday football and believed it was important to support initiatives that encouraged physical exercise and leisure activities. It was also noted that before any decision was taken the views of residents outside of the immediate area around the playing fields need also to be taken into consideration.

Village Impact:

Concerns were also raised about wider impacts on the village during weekends, including reports of increased police presence and broader public order issues, although it was acknowledged these concerns were not solely attributable to football activities.

Dedham Old Boys Football Club response:

The Chairman of the club explained that the football club has been established since 1871 and has never previously needed to seek permission to play weekend football. While the club recognises its responsibility as part of the local community and makes every effort to be considerate, it cannot control player or spectator behaviour once a match has commenced. Match officials are responsible for managing conduct during games, and any concerns regarding behaviour should be reported to the referees.

He emphasised its commitment to working collaboratively with the community to address concerns. He stated that Sunday football is essential to maintaining the club's viability, as many players participate on both Saturdays and Sundays. He also noted that, given the diversity of players' religious beliefs, it

would be inappropriate to determine participation based on religious observance.

The club aims to expand by developing junior and women's teams, ensuring its long-term sustainability. It is financially stable, raises its own funds, and does not seek financial support from the Parish Council. The Chairman highlighted the club's contributions to the village, including supporting the sports club by funding facilities and equipment.

He also stressed that restricting Saturday football would not resolve the underlying issues and highlighted the positive social benefits the club provides, including opportunities for ex-service personnel and individuals with disabilities to participate in sport. He confirmed that the club has safeguarding, respect, and complaints policies in place, with the complaints procedure to be published online and shared with residents where appropriate.

Finally, the Chairman noted that discussions regarding these matters had been ongoing for several months rather than only the previous two weeks. He encouraged all parties to consider the long-term future of the facility, warning that without sufficient football activity it could become underused.

He also emphasised the ongoing challenge of recruiting volunteers, explaining that increased volunteer support would improve the club's ability to monitor behaviour and address community concerns, and invited residents to work with the club to help promote positive conduct.

Additional comments by the Chairman of the Sports Club:

The Chairman stated that he wants all the sporting clubs to thrive but recognises that they need to engage with the community and work with them to provide solutions to their concerns. They are considering the option of filming all games which could also be a deterrent to foul language.

Plans to consider Agreement Between the Football Club and the Parish Council:

It was noted that the Parish Council, as the owner of the football field, had notified the Football and Sports Clubs of its intention to draft, for discussion with the football club, a conditional agreement for the use of its land on Sundays and other times as may be appropriate.

It was confirmed following further comments that to date no such discussions had taken place as additional information had now been gathered.

The Council recognised that there was a need to seek legal advice concerning the Council's responsibilities and status with regard to the playing fields.

Interim Arrangements Regarding Football on Sundays:

No interim arrangements have been made and will be subject to further discussions with relevant bodies and consultation with residents.

To progress matters it was suggested that the Council establish a Sports Field Working Group and that one of the activities of this group will be to ensure a full community consultation regarding the future use of the playing field. The terms of reference for this group will depend on the outcomes of the legal advice.

Legal Advice:

As the Council had agreed that it needed to seek legal advice, another extraordinary meeting will be required to approve this as it was not on the agenda and requires use of public funds. An Extraordinary meeting to be held on 27th July at 7pm to agree the basis for employing legal advice.

Interim Arrangements:

Pending legal advice and completion of the community consultation, the Council agreed that the current position (status quo) should continue.

GIVE YOUR GARDEN GOOD BONES

Welcome back to another year of gardening with the Dedham Horticultural Society. In this year's editions of the Parish Magazine, I'm going to explore ten simple principles of garden design. Don't worry though, I'm not suggesting digging up the whole garden!

Like me, you've probably got a garden that has evolved over many years and in large part you're very happy with it. It has plants you treasure, but it also has gaps where something has never really worked (or maybe it died this summer) and the occasional planting decision you now regret.

Each issue, I'll briefly look at a design principle and suggest small, achievable ways that might help improve our gardens.

I'll share some seasonal plants and things to try, so that over the months we can look at our gardens with fresh eyes.

September is a great time for the first step in improving an established garden: considering your structure, the bones of the garden. Look around and imagine it without all the flowering plants. What's left? Trees, shrubs, hedges, fences, walls, paths and evergreen plants give the garden a framework on which hangs the herbaceous perennials, annuals and bulbs and a succession of colour and interest that changes through the seasons.

I'll walk round my garden and look for areas that already have good structure and those that look empty. For instance, a large evergreen bush died back last year so I removed it in spring. This left a huge gap and completely changed the view in that part of the garden.

For now, I've filled it with a rust-finished obelisk that supports a new white clematis.

When you walk around, think about whether a bare corner would benefit from a well-chosen shrub, if an exposed fence could be softened with a climber or if the view from the house could be transformed by a small tree.

I've an *Amelanchier* in a sunny spot which brings delicate white blossom in spring and autumn colour, but you might decide on a compact crab apple that will give both blossom and fruit. For a shadier area, choose an evergreen such as *Skimmia japonica* 'Rubella' which will provide useful year-round structure.

If you've lost a shrub, you don't have to replace it with an identical plant. Its loss provides an opportunity to rethink the space. Perhaps the garden needs something taller, something evergreen or something that flowers at a different time of year.

Mark possible changes by putting a cane where you think a new shrub might go and live with it for a few weeks before autumn planting begins. If it looks right, plant. If it doesn't, you've saved yourself an expensive mistake.

September is also the month to edit. Look critically at established shrubs. Has something become too large? Is a plant blocking a path or window? Is there a mass of greenery that needs breaking up? Sometimes good design means removing something instead of adding something. Here are a couple of ideas you could try this month to improve structure in your garden.

Choose one important view of your garden, maybe from the kitchen window or back door, and take a photo. When you look at it, your eye will often spot problems that you don't notice when standing in the garden.

Secondly, find one weak point in your garden's structure and decide whether it needs a plant, a pruning job, a move or maybe nothing at all.

As autumn approaches, this is an excellent time to plant many trees and shrubs while the soil is still warm. Don't buy simply because a plant is attractive. Buy because it solves a problem in your garden.

The Horticultural Society's speaker programme kicks off again on 7th October at the Assembly Rooms.

Suffolk Master Composter, Helen Carey, will talk to us about the benefits of composting and encourage us to try it at home. Admission, including free tea or coffee, is only £2 for guests or non-members – and entirely free for members of the Society.
